<b>CURRENCY:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How up-to-date is the information?</li> <li>• Is the date appropriate for your topic?</li> </ul>	
<b>RELEVANCE:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Is the information directly about your topic?</li> <li>• Is it too simple? Too complex?</li> <li>• What audience is this written for?</li> </ul>	
<b>AUTHORITY:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Who is the author? What are his/her credentials?</li> <li>• If there is no individual author, what is the organization that created this and what is their purpose?</li> <li>• Why should you believe the author?</li> </ul>	
<b>ACCURACY:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Where does the information come from?</li> <li>• Is it consistent with unrelated sources?</li> <li>• Does the appearance seem professional?</li> <li>• Are there references or a bibliography?</li> </ul>	
<b>PURPOSE:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Why was this information published?</li> <li>• What audience is this written for?</li> <li>• Is there a commercial or persuasive purpose?</li> </ul>
