What type or format is this source?: e.g. website, blog, news site article, video, book excerpt			
CURRENCY: • How up-to-date is the information? • Is the date appropriate for your topic?			
RELEVANCE: • Is the information directly about your topic? • Is it too simple? Too complex? • What audience is this written for?			
 AUTHORITY: Who is the author? What are his/her credentials? If there is no individual author, what is the organization that created this and what is their purpose? Why should you believe the author? 			
 ACCURACY: Where does the information come from? Is it consistent with unrelated sources? Does the appearance seem professional? Are there references or a bibliography? 			
 PURPOSE: Why was this information published? What audience is this written for? Is there a commercial or persuasive purpose?
