Bhagavad Gita, part of Mahabharata, Vedas, Upanishads, in Sanskrit

Arjuna, kshatriya warrior (Pandavas and Kauravas), and Krishna (Avatar)

Vishnu (Preserver), Shiva (Destroyer), Brahma (Creator), Brahman (Supreme – Infinite)

AUM

Darshana “auspicious sight” an experienced seeing, Hindu

Samsara (reincarnation) – Karma (past deeds)

Maya (illusion)

Dharma (duty, responsibility)

“Act, renouncing the fruits of your actions”

Moksha (Liberation, Infinite, ???; not a goal, but an outcome)

Path of Desire: Kama (Kamadeva), Artha (Ganesha); Path of Renunciation: Dharma (Hanuman), Moksha

Maya, Gunas, Tamas, Rajas, Sattva
