'Alatam'áal (February)

"New life begins in the cow elk"

"Fires are needed"

## Large semi-permanent winter villages of tule-mat longhouses

## Foods are adequate

Foods becoming scarcer

Sexliw'áal (November)

"Trees shed leaves"

Prepare winter villages

Hunting continues

<u>Hóopl'al</u> (October)
"Needles fall from Tamarack"

Smaller mobile groups foods are adequate

Pik'unmaayq'áal (September)

"Fish go downstream and salmon to ocean"

Latíit'aal (March)
"First flowers bloom"

Small mobile groups with foods scarce Begin root digging and continue hunting

Qaq'iit'áal (April)

"Time to dig qaq'iit roots"

Begin larger summer camps continue root digging and begin fishing

'Apa'áal (May)

"Time to dig cous roots"

After the horse, travel to buffalo country

Large summer camps with foods superabundant Fishing continues with berry gathering and root digging throughout summer

Waw'amaayq'áal (August)

Tustimasáat'al (June)

"Late season for cous roots"

"Chinook salmon to headwater's and spawn"

Travel to falls for trading and gathering

Tay'áal (July)

"Time of blueback salmon at Wallowa Lake"
