11.30 Climb tower|131 steps [optional]. In inclement weather the tower may be closed for safety reasons.

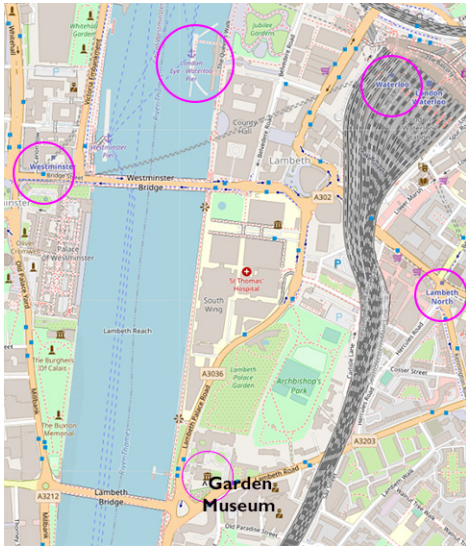
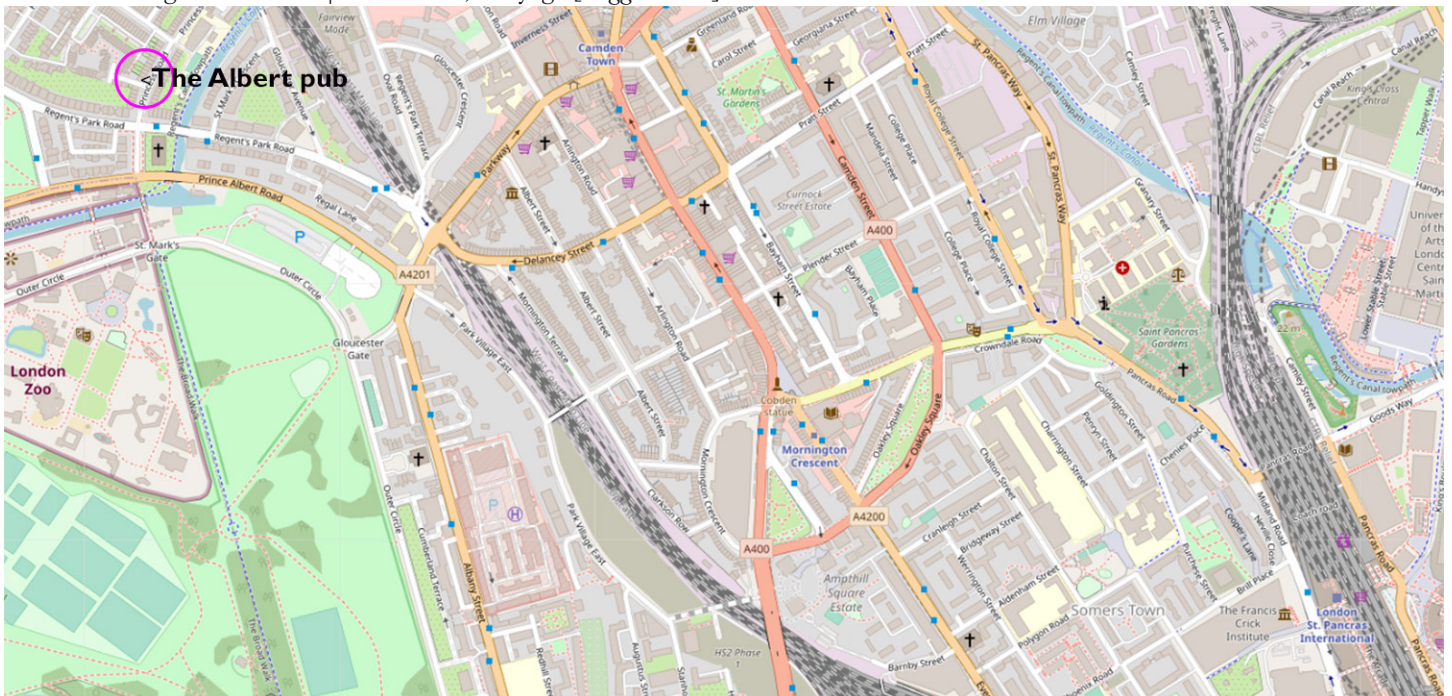

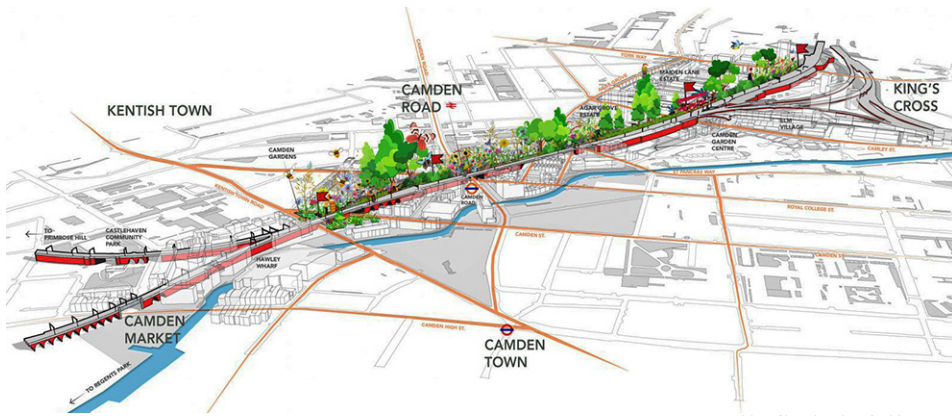
