- Dr. Stoll is serving on NASPE's (National Association of Sport and Physical Education) Code of Ethics Task Force. The committee is charged with writing a code of ethics for their 16,000 members who include k-12 physical education teachers, coaches, athletic directors, athletic trainers, sport management professionals, researchers, and college/university faculty who prepare physical activity professionals. The other members of the team are R. Scott Kretchmar, professor of exercise and sport science Pennsylvania State University and probably the leading sport ethicist in the US, Angela Lumpkin, former Dean, School of Education, University of Kansas, and presently professor department of health, sport, and exercise science, and Russell L. Carson, of Louisiana State University.
