- *Dr. Stoll is the editor of the International Association of the Philosophy of Sport. The IAPS newsletter for July was online for members as of July 31, 2009. Established in 1972 as the Philosophic Society for the Study of Sport with its name changed in 1999. The purpose of the organization is to stimulate, encourage, and promote study, research, and writing in the philosophy of sporting (and related) activity; to demonstrate the relevance of philosophic thought concerning sport to matters of professional concern; to organize and conduct meetings concerning the philosophy of sport; to issue publications concerning the philosophy of sport; to support and to cooperate with local, national, and international organizations of similar purpose; to affiliate with national and international organizations of similar purpose; and to engender national, regional, and continental affiliates devoted to the philosophic study of sport. ## • Dr. Stoll Panel Reviewer for Research Consortium

- *Dr. Stoll was a panel reviewer for the 2010 AAHPERD convention in Indianapolis. Research Consortium. The Research Consortium serves as the coordinating organization within AAHPERD in support of research across the disciplines and the professions served by AAHPERD. AAHPERD is an alliance of five national associations, six district associations, and a research consortium which support healthy lifestyles through high quality programs. Nineteen panel chairs headed a group of 178 review professionals in 19 separate subdisciplines, including but limited to exercise physiology, socio-cultural, dance, biomechanics, health, recreation, and sport psychology, to review over 300 research abstracts and symposium. The reviewed abstracts by the review professionals were then accepted or rejected by the panel chairs of each subdiscipline. Dr. Stoll served as review panelist for the subdiscipline of socio-cultural research.*
