Jimmy Graham, a high school basketball coach from Fergus High School, contacted the Center for ETHICS* about the development of ethical and moral student athletes in his high school. Jimmy purchased the Winning With Character curriculum for the student athletes in his high school and will begin implementing the program this fall.

A report was created and sent out to Montana State University. As part of our continuing relationship with Winning With Character, we assess moral reasoning and moral development for programs involved in WWC's character education program. The program has proven to be successful in increasing the moral reasoning and moral development of their athletes.

A report was created and sent out to Georgia Military College (GMC) as well. GMC is one of the premiere Junior colleges in the nation and home to a NJCAA national championship. In 2012, GMC had 28 football players advance to 4 year colleges upon completion of their stay. GMC is also a participant in the WWC program continues to be successful in the moral development of their athletes.

A report was created and sent out to Georgia Military Preparatory High School (GMP). GMP participates in the WWC program and strives to develop the moral reasoning of their students.
