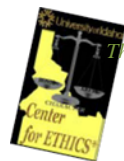


IN BRIEF: THIS WEEK AT THE CENTER FOR ETHICS*

He is there presenting the findings of his dissertation, Moral Reasoning of the U.S. Marine Corps Lieutenants while at The Basic School (TBS). Dr. Culp was with TBS for eight months working to improve the pedagogy of TBS’ ethics education program. His findings are reported in his dissertation and he is meeting with the Commanding Officer of the Basic School, Col. J. D. Alford, to discuss strategies to continue the implementation for future Marine officers. Dr. Culp is Dr. Stoll’s 21st completed doctorate student.
