The Center houses the largest depository of information on moral reasoning for competitive populations in the world today.
- Seth Haselhuhn with Dr. Damon Burton had a manuscript "Creating Consistent Hitters: A Growth Hitting System Approach to Promote a Mastery Climate in Collegiate Baseball" accepted pending revisions to the *Journal* of Sport Psychology in Action. - The Center received a request for information on our intervention programs from the Director of Athletics at finger Lakes Community College, Canandaigua, NY.
