Dr. C. Keith Harrison will be guest lecturing in Dr. Stoll's ISEM 101 Honors class this coming Wednesday, as well as MVSC 570 on Thursday.

Dr. Harrison's career focus is in a few areas: the identity of the student-athlete and professional athlete experience; diversity and inclusion issues related to gender and race relations in education, business, sport and entertainment; and the marketing of emerging multicultural demographics in the global environment in terms of fan engagement.
