Dr. Stoll is continuing in her role as president of Phi Kappa Phi, Chapter 079, at the University of Idaho. Phi Kappa Phi is one of the oldest academic honor societies. In 1897, ten senior students, two faculty members and the University of Maine president created a new kind of honor society, one that recognized excellence in all academic disciplines. Under the leadership of student Marcus L. Urann, the group formed the Lambda Sigma Eta Society, later renamed Phi Kappa Phi from the letters of the Greek words forming its motto, *Philosophía Krateítō Phōtōn*, "Let the love of learning rule humanity." Today, Phi Kappa Phi recognizes and promotes academic excellence in all fields of higher education and engages the community of scholars in service to others.

Dr. Stoll gave the scholarship lecture for the men of Sigma Chi on Wednesday, October 25, during their scholarship dinner. The title of her talk was, *The Importance of ISEM in developing a liberal education experience*. Dr. Stoll was invited by Chad Robertson, scholarship chair, who was enrolled in one of the ISEM classes that Dr. Stoll taught in 2015.
