 - c. You *must* interpret or state your opinion but you *also must* clearly identify the author's claims as opposed to your own.
 - d. Your examples and topics *should come together* in a conclusion, which supports your claim.

 - iv. Implications for definitions of sustainability, restoration, and reclamation
 - i. Ecosystem services and environmental economics
 - ii. Working with the public and incorporating scientific expertise
