Direct Findings

We had six (6) students take their comprehensive exams this year. For us this is a record number of students taking the exams in a single year. All the students passed the exams demonstrating competence in meeting our learning goals. Four of the students passed the exams on the first try while two students were asked to rewrite one question. These two performed well when asked to do the question over. We had no students finish their dissertation this year.

Indirect Findings

We have been working on getting a more complete account of where our students have gone and how they are employed. The most recent student to complete her dissertation has a non-tenure track full time lectureship. Two of the recent students taking their exams have full time employment in the U.S. Two have left the country to return to their native country and we don't have any information on their employment. Two other students are employed as TA's for this department.

Curricular and Co-Curricular Changes to be Made **Edit**

We have discussed altering our exam fields to emphasize public policy but haven't reached a conclusion on this. We now require 535 for all our graduate students and this has improved the quantitative skills of our students. Increased difficulty in having our students taking courses at WSU has led to a discussion of whether we will continue to require their Scope of Political Science course.
