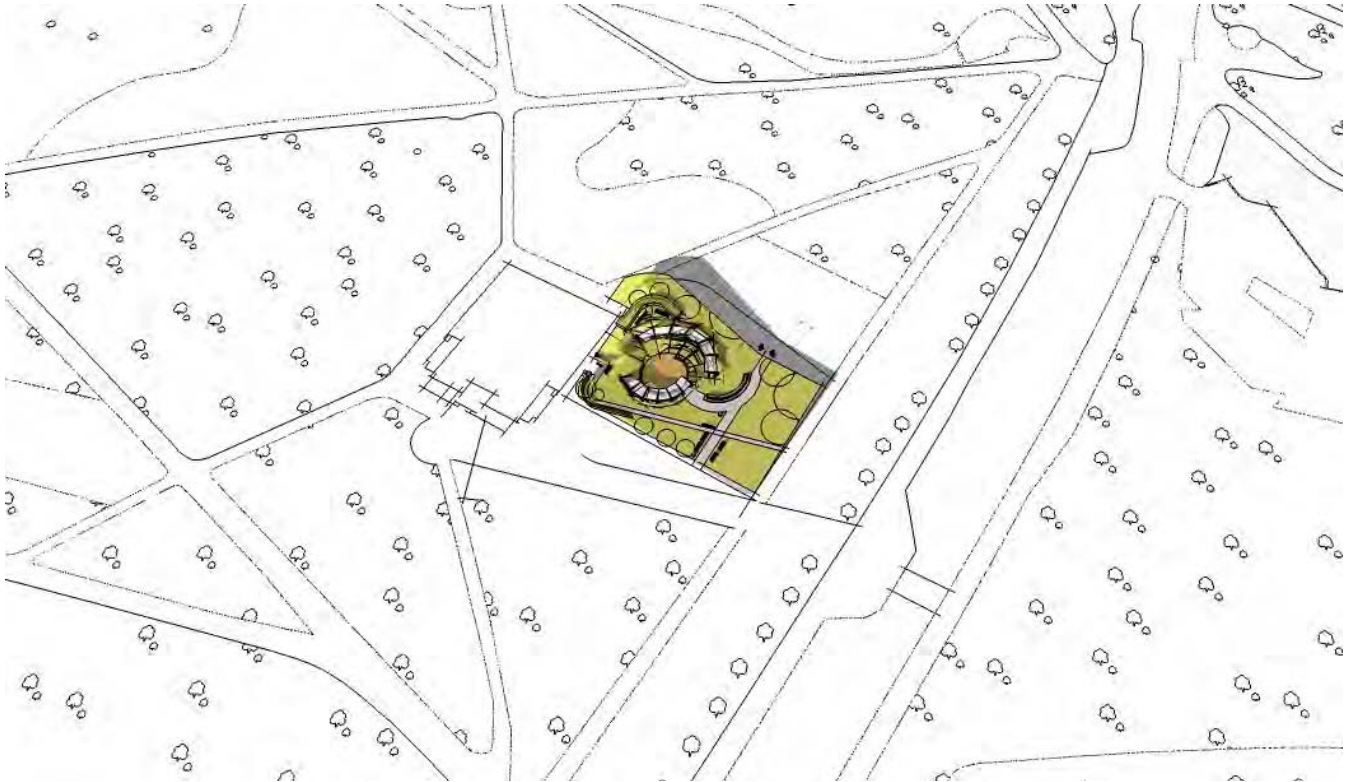

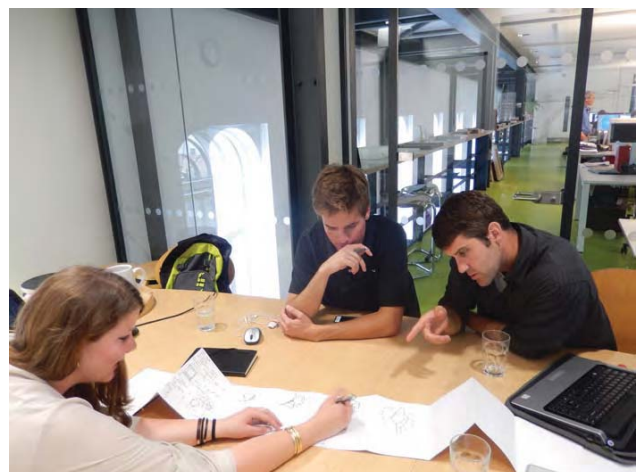


BRIEF: The appointed architectural practice may wish to consider -

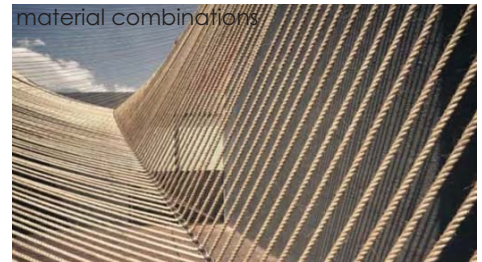
- + The historic, social and physical context of the Serpentine, together with the history and layout of the existing building, and the Gallery's Exhibition, Education and Public Programmes
- + An innovative use of materials, both new and traditional
- + The Serpentine Gallery's cultural mission to present international modern and contemporary art, architecture and education and public programmes to a diverse and international audience
- + The visitor's experience of art, architecture, education and public programmes within the 'natural' setting of a large green space in central London
- + A design that does not obscure the Serpentine's east façade, but enhances the relationship between gallery, lawn, terrace and park landscape
- + The windows in the East Gallery overlooking the Serpentine's lawn may remain open, which means that visitors to the exhibition will be able to view the Pavilion from inside the Gallery. The design of the Pavilion therefore should respond to the possibility of being experienced from this vantage point

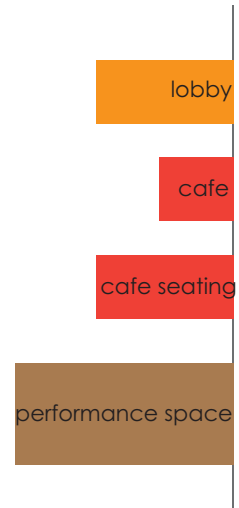

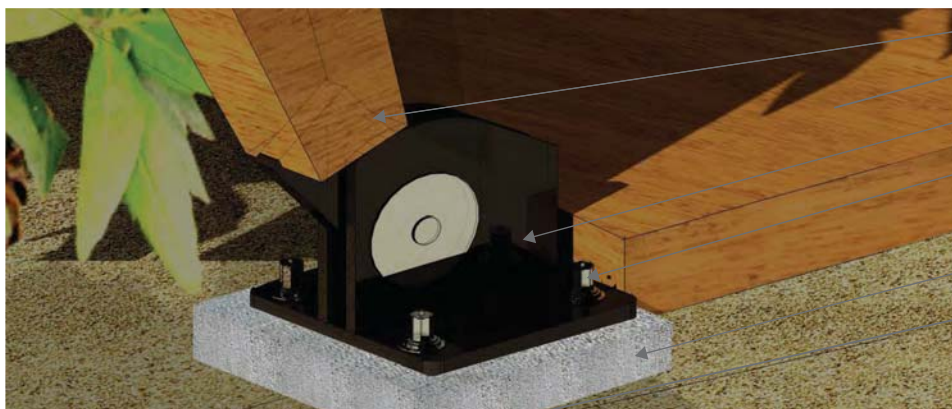

SYNOPSIS:

Our design achieves our goal of creating an environmentally conscious pavilion that was influenced by London's active culture. Through the implementation of:

- observing the surrounding context with respect to the Serpentine Gallery
- requiring human powered transportation to the pavilion by foot and bike
- a flexible multi use performance space
- a environmentally conscious cafe menu
- educational recycling graphics showing what you can do and why you should recycle through the activity of doing so
- sustainable strategies further reinforced through visual elements by the engagement of the occupants in the pavilion
