- He left Prague in 1968 at the age of 31 to pursue design in London
- Jan made a reputation as an intelligent yet difficult architect, working with such masters as Piano-Rogers and Sir Norman Foster before founding his group.
- Founded “Future Systems” in 1979 with fellow architect David Nixon.
- Amanda Levete joined the firm in 1987 after which the firm began receiving notably more attention for their progressively modern designs and competition entries
- Future Systems maintains a critical balance between client-based projects and exploratory projects, keeping themselves on the cutting edge of modern design.

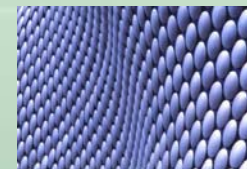

Design Philosophy

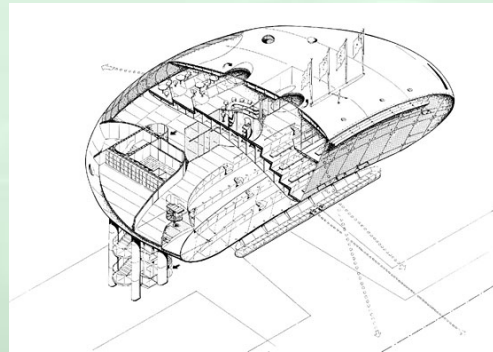
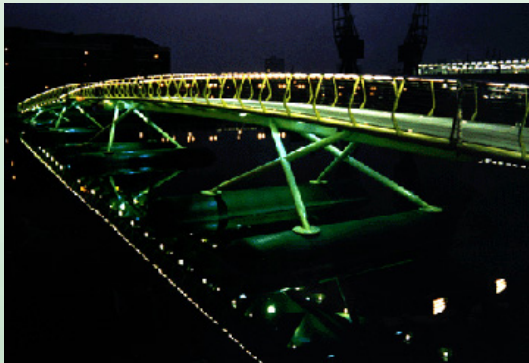
Future Systems
