Georgia Military has been a member of the WWC family for approximately five years. **GMC** is a public-independent educational institution, comprised of a junior college and a separate preparatory school (grades 6-12), whose mission and purpose is to produce educated citizens by providing junior college students with a liberal arts based two-year undergraduate curriculum, by providing selected college students with ROTC training, and by providing preparatory school students an inclusive college preparatory curriculum that includes a military training component--all in an environment conducive to the holistic development of the intellect and character of its students. GMC has been in discussion with the Center to create a total character curriculum for their preparatory school.

- Helen Brown, HPERD grant writer, and the staff of HPERD and in the final stages of developing a grant for the Templeton Foundation on Servant leadership for Athletic coaches.
