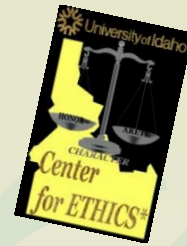


THIS WEEK AT THE CENTER FOR ETHICS*

- Dr. Stoll finished a peer review for an article in *Quest*. In the physical activity field in higher education, there's no single journal that covers more topics of common interest than *Quest*. Each issue examines not only critical issues facing physical educators, but also research developments in the sport sciences and other sub-disciplines of human movement. This was her third review this academic year.
- Dr. Stoll and the Center team was solicited by Dr. Slava Popovsky to prepare a paper for the St. Petersburg's Lesgaft Physical Culture State University to publish in an international scientific conference they will be holding September 24-27, 2008--Physical Culture and Sports: Analysis of Social Processes. Dr. Popovsky often lectures to Dr. Stoll's classes when he visits the Palouse. A former USSR Olympic volleyball coach, he now resides and teaches in the Seattle area.
- Dr. Stoll, Dr. Angela Lumpkin (Kansas State University, and Dr. Jennifer Beller of WSU are in process of submitting a proposal for a text in Sport Ethics to academic presses in the US.

Georgia Military College is a public-independent educational institution, comprised of a junior college and a separate preparatory school (grades 6-12), whose mission and purpose is to produce educated citizens by providing junior college students with a liberal arts based two-year undergraduate curriculum, by providing selected college students with ROTC training, and by providing preparatory school students an inclusive college preparatory curriculum that includes a military training component--all in an environment conducive to the holistic development of the intellect and character of its students.
 - Dr. Stoll will be traveling with Dr. Beller to Montana State to do workshop with football team, in late July.
 - David Brunner will be doing an intervention with 100 football players from Southridge High School in Kennewick, WA., June 17 and 18th. The school we be attending the University of Idaho Football Camp. The head coach is Andy Troxel.
 - Dr. Stoll will be traveling to Oklahoma City on Friday, August 1, with Winning With Character to do a workshop with a high school football team.
