- Lynda Cochran, Dr. Stoll, Dr. Beller, and Dr. Grace Goc Karp have a paper accepted for publication in *Schole*, *A Journal of Leisure Studies and Recreation Education*. *Schole* **considered a Tier I Publication** is the official refereed publication of the Society of Park and Recreation Educators, a branch of the National Recreation and Park Association, which aims to disseminate knowledge related to park and recreation courses, curricula, and teaching. It is published annually in August. Articles address a wide range of issues

- concerning graduate and undergraduate education. The article addresses the use of philosophy to develop programming practices in recreation and leisure education.
- Dr. Stoll gave a keynote for the National convention of the Seventh Day Adventist Health Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance association in Keene, TX on Monday, April 7.
  The Seventh Day Adventist HPERD group, about 100 members, meets each year at the national AAHPERD convention site for their particular focus sessions. Dr. Stoll spoke on: "From Floyd Landis to Roger Clemens: What to Learn from the Current Ethics' Scandals in Sport.
