CEUs Completed

- Stan Outland of Palm Beach Forest Hill High School and James Wynn of Upson-Lee Middle School finished a 30 hour, 3 CEU (Continuing Education Unit) program with the Center for ETHICS, University of Idaho. The Sport Servant Leadership Course was developed by the University of Idaho Center for ETHICS* to assist coaches and teams in developing a sense of unity built upon a foundation of character. The course creates an environment to aid the coach in their quest to become a servant leader. Coaches certified in the Sport Servant Leadership Course learn the traits, gifts, and the mission of individuals who are servant leaders Upon completion the coaches receive the 3 hours of CEU; a certificate of completion, a press release to their local paper, and a confirmation letter to their principal and athletic director.
