# Book Chapter Proposal submitted.

Van Mullem, P. W., Van Mullen, H., & Stoll, S.K. Wiki Learning: Success and Failure. Van Mullem, Van Mullem, and Stoll (St. Cloud University, Lewis Clark State College, and University of Idaho) did a collaborative Wike learning project in the spring, 2011. This proposal for a chapter addition is the result of this work. The Call for the proposal is to develop a text that brings together global scholars, researchers, and practitioners to provide models and discussion regarding the use of technology to respond successfully to the challenges previously cited. This book aims at being an interdisciplinary piece of work. Its goal is to convey both the transfer of knowledge between disciplines and to exchange experience on the effective use of technology that leads to the creation of new behaviors and methods. Addressing either K-12 or higher education within each section as well as applications in and out of school, the key areas to be attended to within the sections include:

#### NASPE reviews done:

The purpose of TBS: Train and educate newly commissioned or appointed officers in the high standards of professional knowledge, esprit-de-corps, and leadership required to prepare them for duty as company grade officers in the operating forces, with particular emphasis on the duties, responsibilities and warfighting skills required of a rifle platoon commander.
