Doctoral Student Tom Grant to India

Tom Grant, PhD student at the Center for ETHICS*, is traveling to India to produce a short documentary about the International Photography Partnerships project of D.K. Bhaskar. With the support of Nikon and other sponsors, Bhaskar is taking a large number of small digital cameras to Chamba, a community in the foothills of the Himalayas. Bhaskar teaches children in the community to use the cameras, and over the next seven days they document the life in their village. At the end of the week, Bhaskar produces an exhibit of their work for the community. The purpose of the project is to capture some of India's cultural heritage before it's obscured by the rapid technological changes occurring in the nation. As one reporter said, the images have been stunning, a re-discovery of the world through the eyes of children. Chamba is the fourth village in India where Bhaskar has taken the International Photography Partnerships project.
