Dr. Stoll received edits for her History of Philosophy of Sport article for the *Encyclopedia of Educational Philosophy and Theory*. The editor, M.A. Peters, after review spoke highly of the history because of its link to the history of physical education in North America.

Dr. Stoll as president of Phi Kappa Phi, was present to induct the 2015 members, Thursday evening, December 10. Phi Kappa Phi was begun in 1897, and is open to the upper 10 percent of seniors and upper 7.5 percent of juniors from all disciplines.
