Review

Dr. Stoll completed an invited review for *The International Journal of Sports Science and Coaching*, Simon Jenkins, editor. The invited review will be published. *The International Journal of Sports Science and Coaching*, located in Leeds, England, is a peer-reviewed, international, academic/professional journal, which aims to bridge the gap between coaching and sports science. The journal integrates theory and practice in sports science, promotes critical reflection of coaching practice, and evaluates commonly accepted beliefs about coaching effectiveness and performance enhancement. Open learning systems will be promoted in which: (a) sports science is made accessible to coaches, translating knowledge into working practice; and (b) the challenges faced by coaches are communicated to sports scientists.
