# Ethical Theory and Honor in Competition and Sport

Dr. Stoll was a consultant and speaker for the Whittier College, Whittier, CA., Mellon Grant. The purpose of the grant is to create courses, invite speakers, and generate a campus-wide rethinking of the term "leadership" in relation to sport, kinesiology, and nutrition sciences. Their goal is to merge the liberal arts with leadership development (both concepts and practice) in areas that are not often integrated fully into liberal arts curricula: business and kinesiology. Dr. Stoll spent two days on campus speaking to classes, faculty, staff, and student in three different locales.

Dr. Stoll, as a reviewer, is presenting reviewing two articles for <u>Quest's</u> <u>Quest's</u> primary purpose is to publish manuscripts 1) that address issues and concerns relevant and meaningful to the field of kinesiology; 2) that are original research reports that address empirical questions that are contextualized within higher education and hold significance to a broad range of faculty and administrators in kinesiology; and 3) that provide a review of literature and/or research of interest to one or more sub-disciplines in kinesiology.

Tom Anderson, Dr. Stoll's 29<sup>th</sup> doctoral student, presented at the 2017 the Association for Experiential Education Southeast Regional Conference. Tom's research presentation, which stems from his doctoral studies with Dr. Stoll, addresses the effect of adventure programs on the self-efficacy of their participants. The purpose of his study was to assess the effect of a selected adventure program on self-efficacy in adult learners to meet the challenge of the integrated business core at a private institution located in the Northwest.
