


# THIS WEEK AT THE CENTER FOR ETHICS\*

- Dr. Stoll was interviewed for an hour by Stuart Woo, a San Francisco based reporter for the Wall Street Journal, about doping.
- Three new students, coaches across the US and Idaho, has signed up for the Servant Leadership Coaching CEU that is offered through the University of Idaho/Center for ETHICS\*. Upon completion, a participant wins 3 CEU hours and a certificate of completion.
- Nolan Catholic High School, a Marianist college preparatory school in Fort Worth, TX has requested a joint research project to develop a general school leadership curriculum in servant leadership. Dr. Stoll will be working with them to develop the curriculum over the next few years and will be traveling to do a workshop with them in August. The contract/grant for this project will be approximately \$5-7000 per year for 4 years minimally.
- Gilmour Reeve, president of Research Consortium of the American Alliance of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance, invited Dr. Stoll to serve on the Research Consortium Committee on Awards. Dr. Stoll has served Research Consortium in a number of capacities in reviewing grant applications as well as research abstracts for presentation at the yearly AAHPERD Meeting.
- Kim Robertello, one of our new Ph.D.s interviewed for a position at Washington State University this past week.
- Justin Barnes, one of our doctoral students, was contacted by the University Core Discovery program to teach Sport and Society in the fall. Dr. Stoll presently teaches in Sport and Society in Core. The course has been important to the Center in understanding the reasoning and ethical processes of 19 year old men and women. Ninety five percent of students enrolled in Sport and Society are males.
- Georgia Military College's, one of Winning with Character's clients, post test data was analyzed by the Center staff this week. Georgia Military has been a part of the WWC family and thus our research for six years.
- Dr. Andrew Rudd, who received his Ph.D. here and is the author of one of our main evaluative inventories in social and moral reasoning in sport – the Rudd Inventory, was recognized by the Provost of Florida State University for outstanding teaching in 2008 and was also nominated for a graduate level teaching award. Dr. Rudd has been a faculty member in Sport Management at FSU for approximately five years.

- **Coming events:**
  - Training with WWC is scheduled for June 23 in Athens, GA, presently we have approximately 15 new schools scheduled, plus approximately 30 returning schools..
  - Dr. Stoll will be visiting Georgia Military College for a workshop on June 24 in Milledgeville, GA. Georgia Military has been a member of the WWC family for approximately five years. Georgia Military College is a public-independent educational institution, comprised of a junior college and a separate preparatory school (grades 6-12), whose mission and purpose is to produce educated citizens by providing junior college students with a liberal arts based two-year undergraduate curriculum, by providing selected college students with ROTC training, and by providing preparatory school students an inclusive college preparatory curriculum that includes a military training component--all in an environment conducive to the holistic development of the intellect and character of its students.
  - Dr. Stoll will be traveling with Dr. Beller to Montana State to do workshop with football team, July 23 and 24.
  - David Brunner will be doing an intervention with 100 football players from Southridge High School in Kennewick, WA., June 17 and 18<sup>th</sup>. The school we be attending the University of Idaho Football Camp. The head coach is Andy Troxel.
  - Dr. Stoll will be traveling to Oklahoma City on Friday, August 1, with Winning With Character to do a workshop with a high school football team.
