We offer 1.5 million books, bound journals, CDs, DVDs, and government documents; 2.5 million units of microform; electronic access to almost 900,000 ebooks and tens of thousands of journals; streaming music and video; hundreds of specialized databases; and rich and varied special collections, many of which have been digitized. Summit - Resource sharing service that provides access to print materials and media from 39 academic libraries throughout Oregon, Washington and Idaho. Summit results appear in our library catalog, and Summit items can be requested directly through that interface.
