



2017-2018 ANNUAL DATA

- Total Students: 451
- 4% of all UI enrolled students received formal accommodations
- 36 off-campus students (Boise, CDA, McCall, Outreach)
- Assigned 2,658 accommodations
- Proctored 1,920 accommodated exams
- Raven Scholars conducted 1,415 contacts with students
- Access consultant had 1,700 contacts with students
