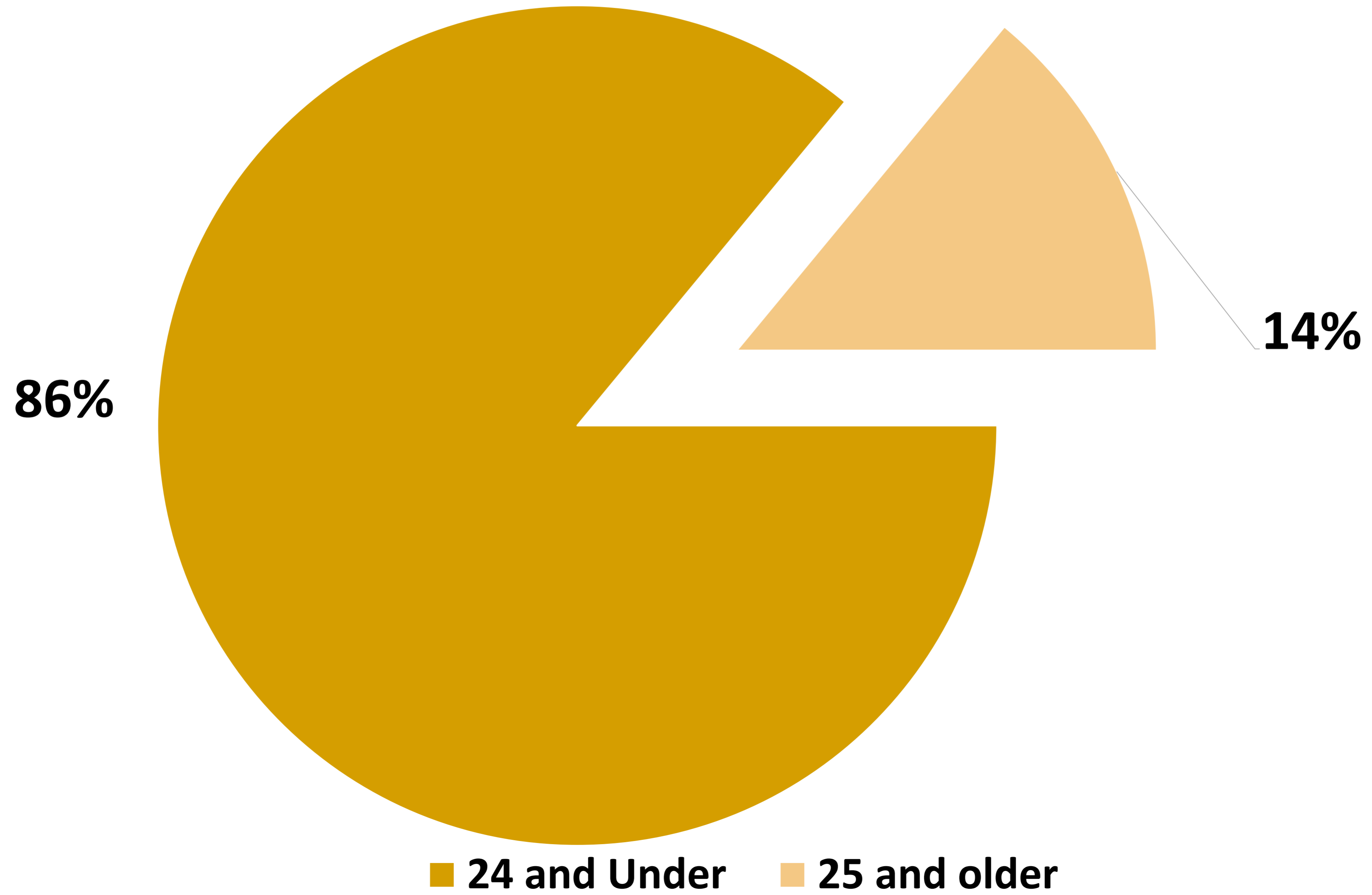

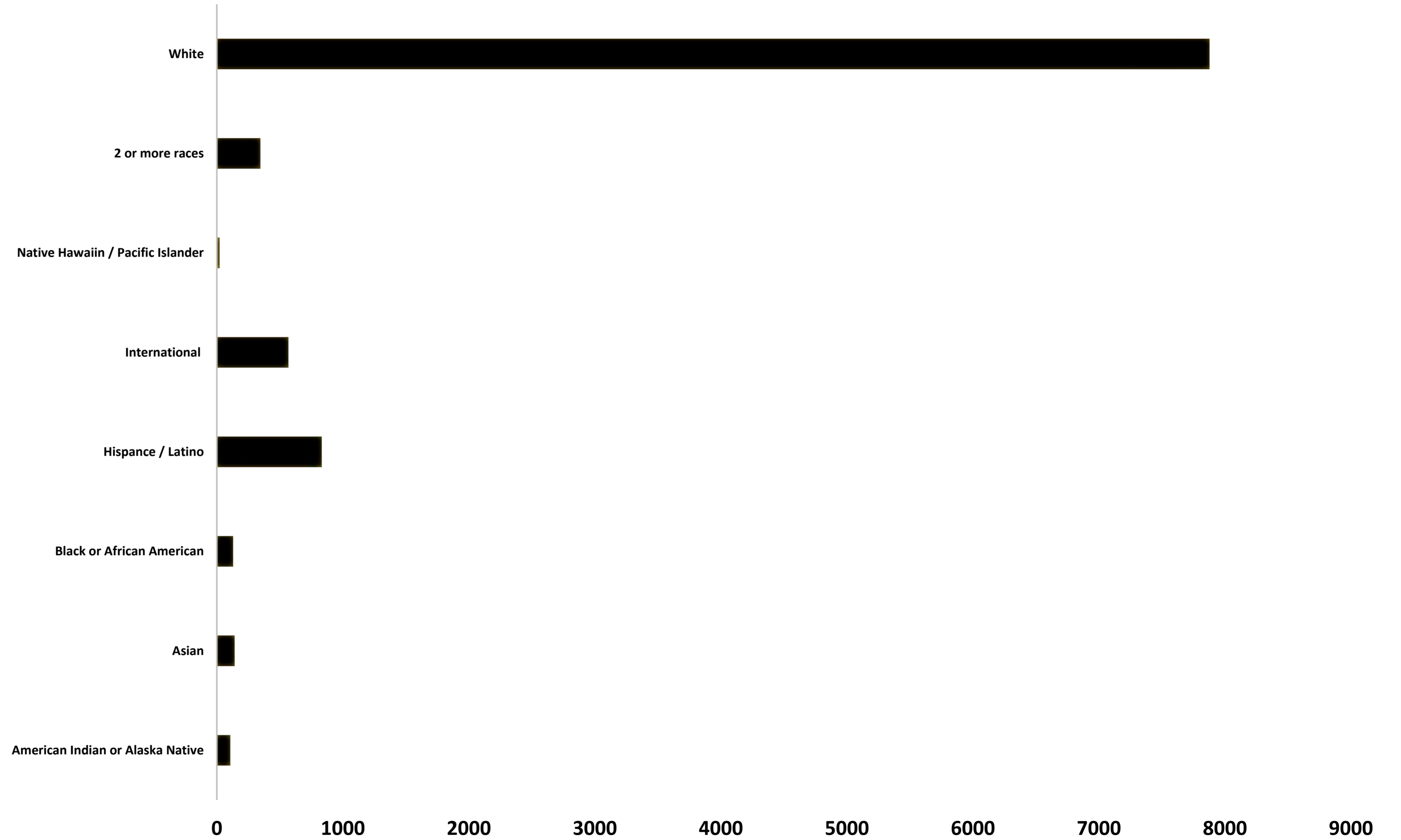

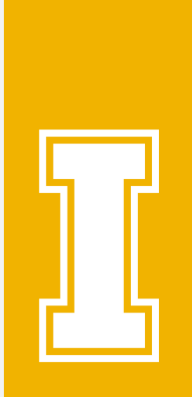

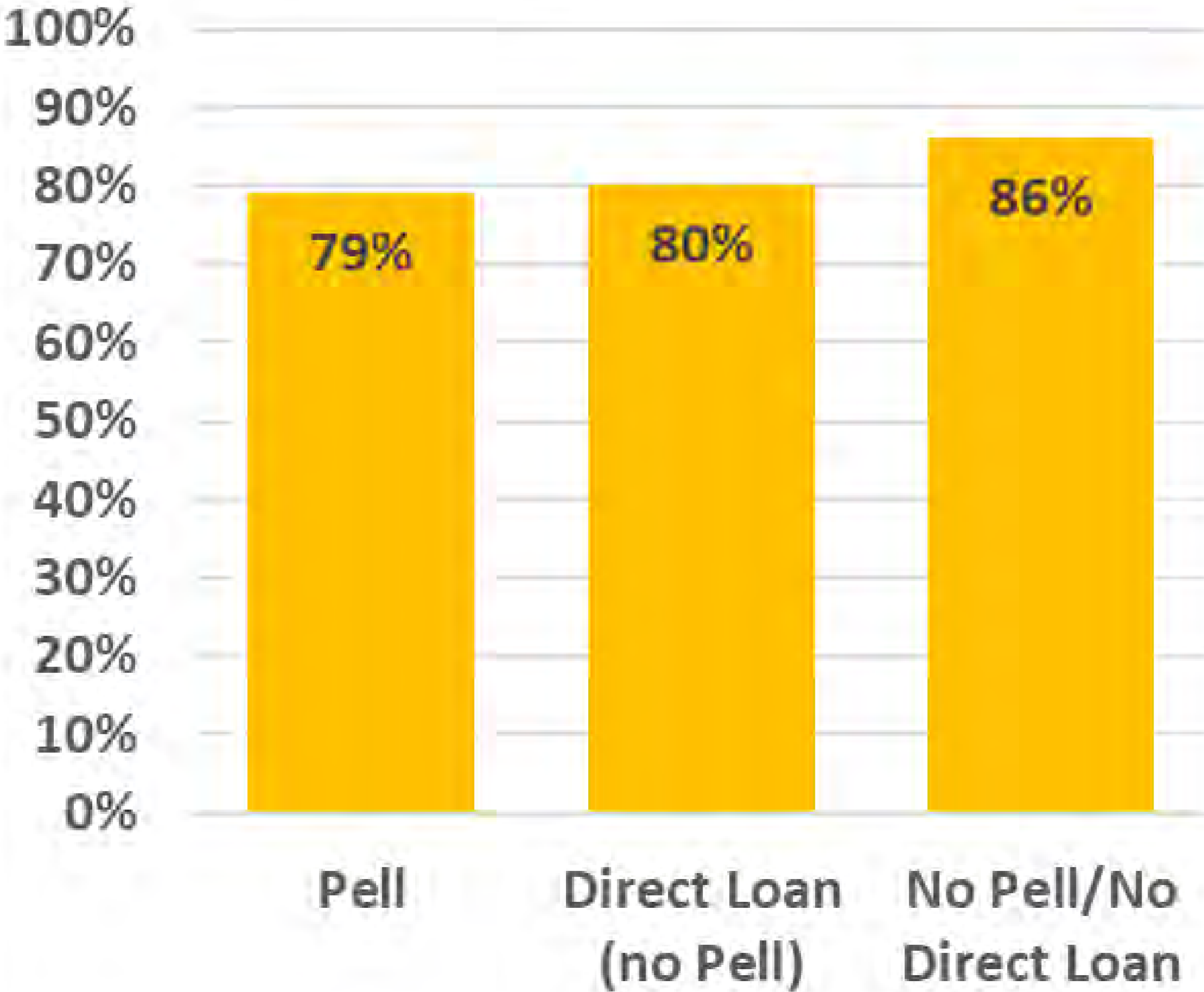
STUDENT ETHNICITY



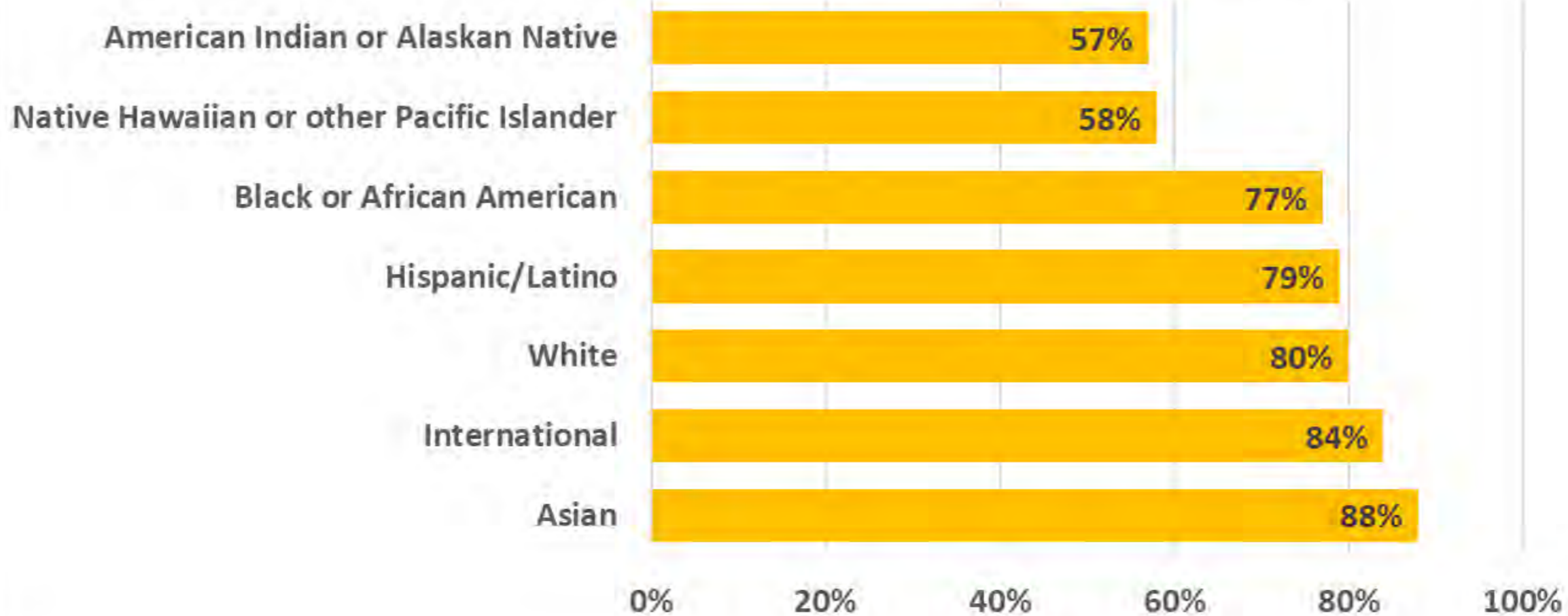
RETENTION (FIRST TIME, FULL TIME)



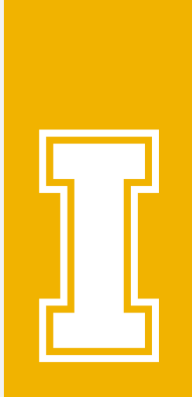
FTFT Retention Rates by Pell/Direct Loan Status for Cohort 2016-2017

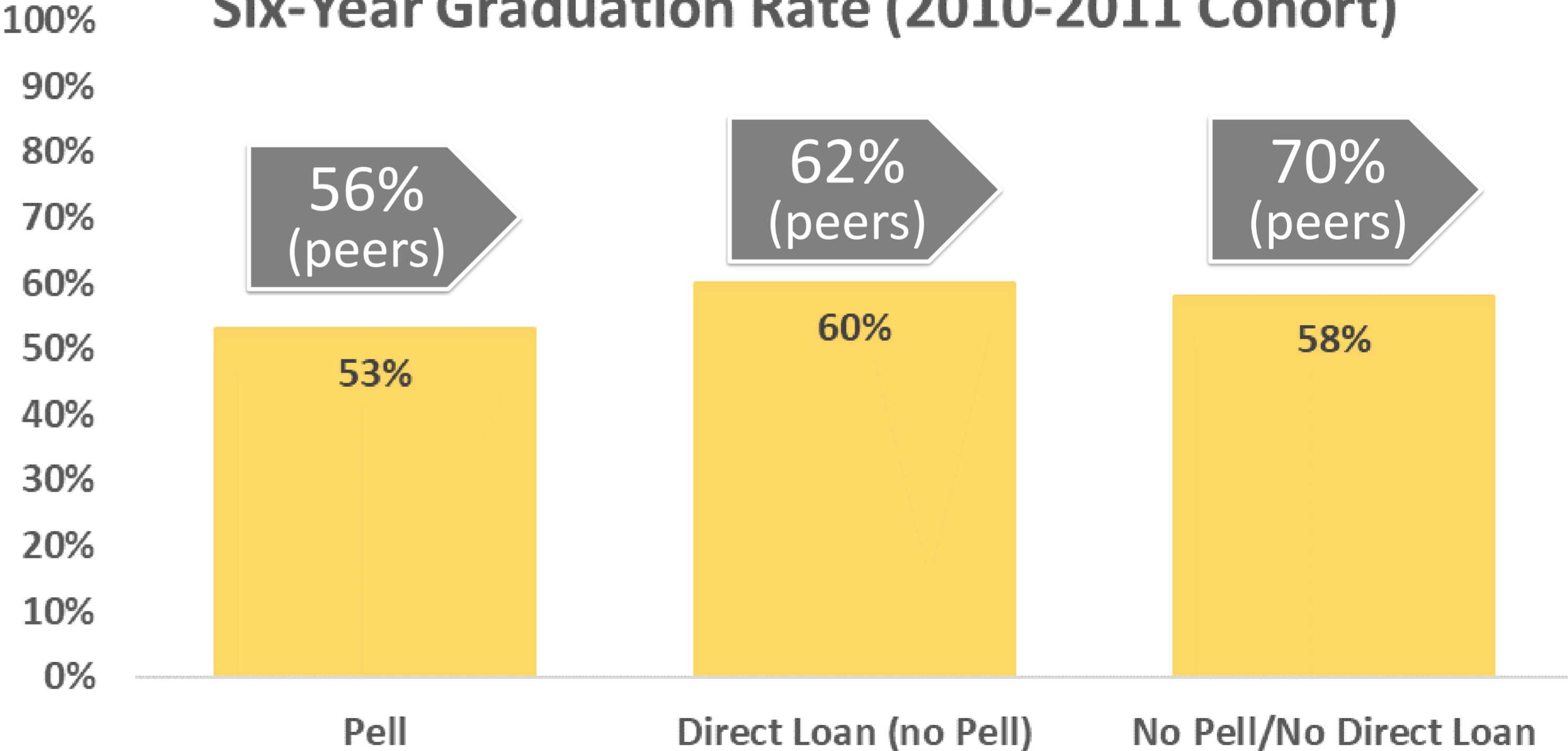

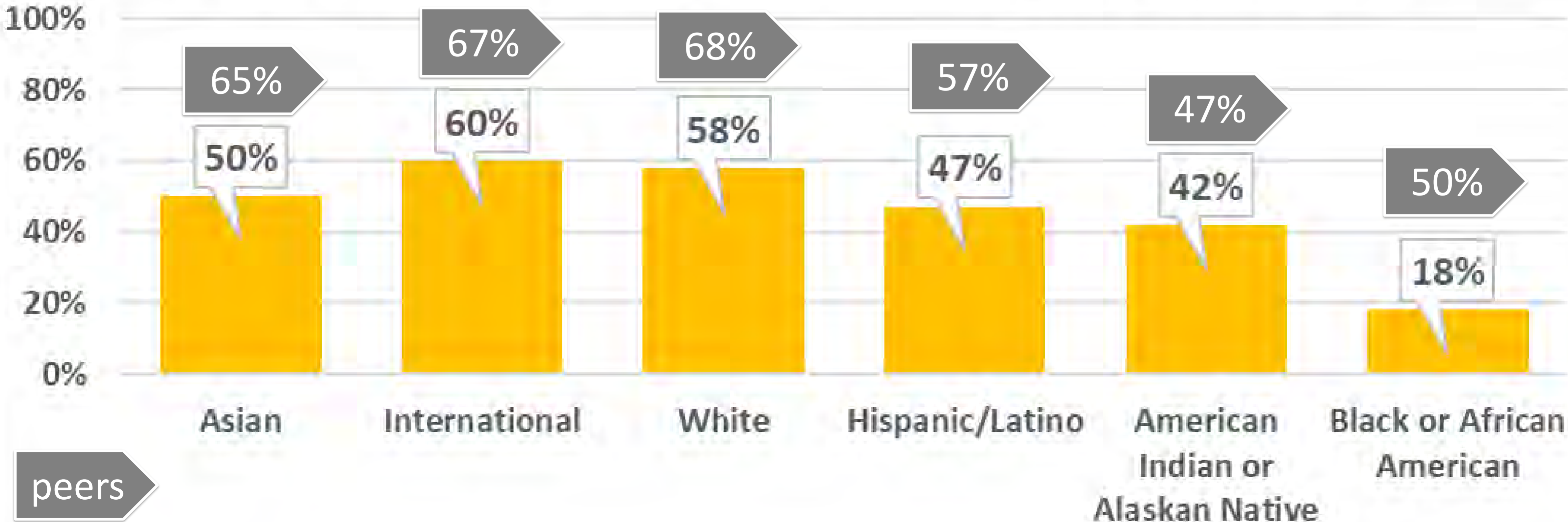
Six-Year Graduation Rate (2010-2011 Cohort)



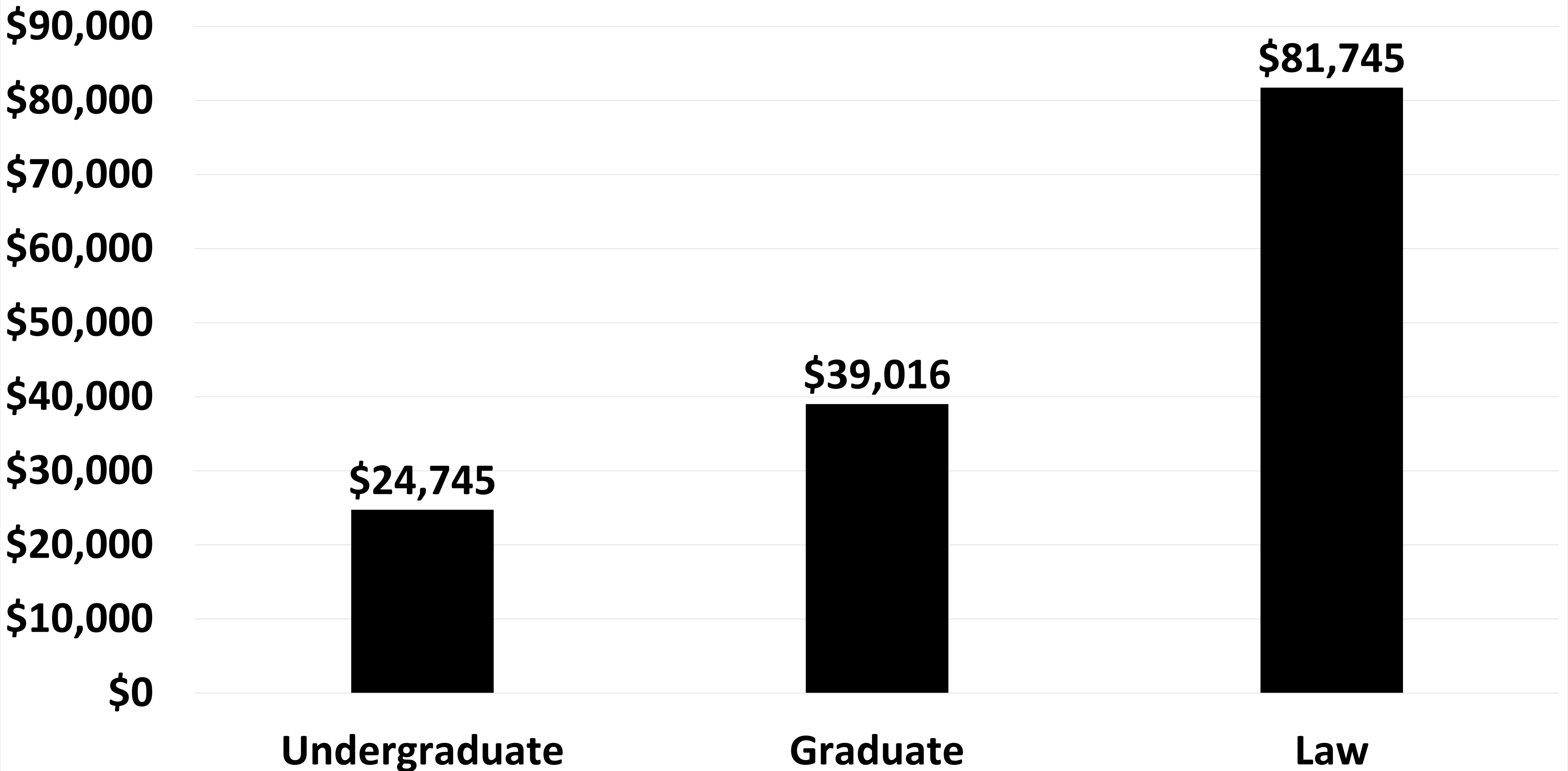

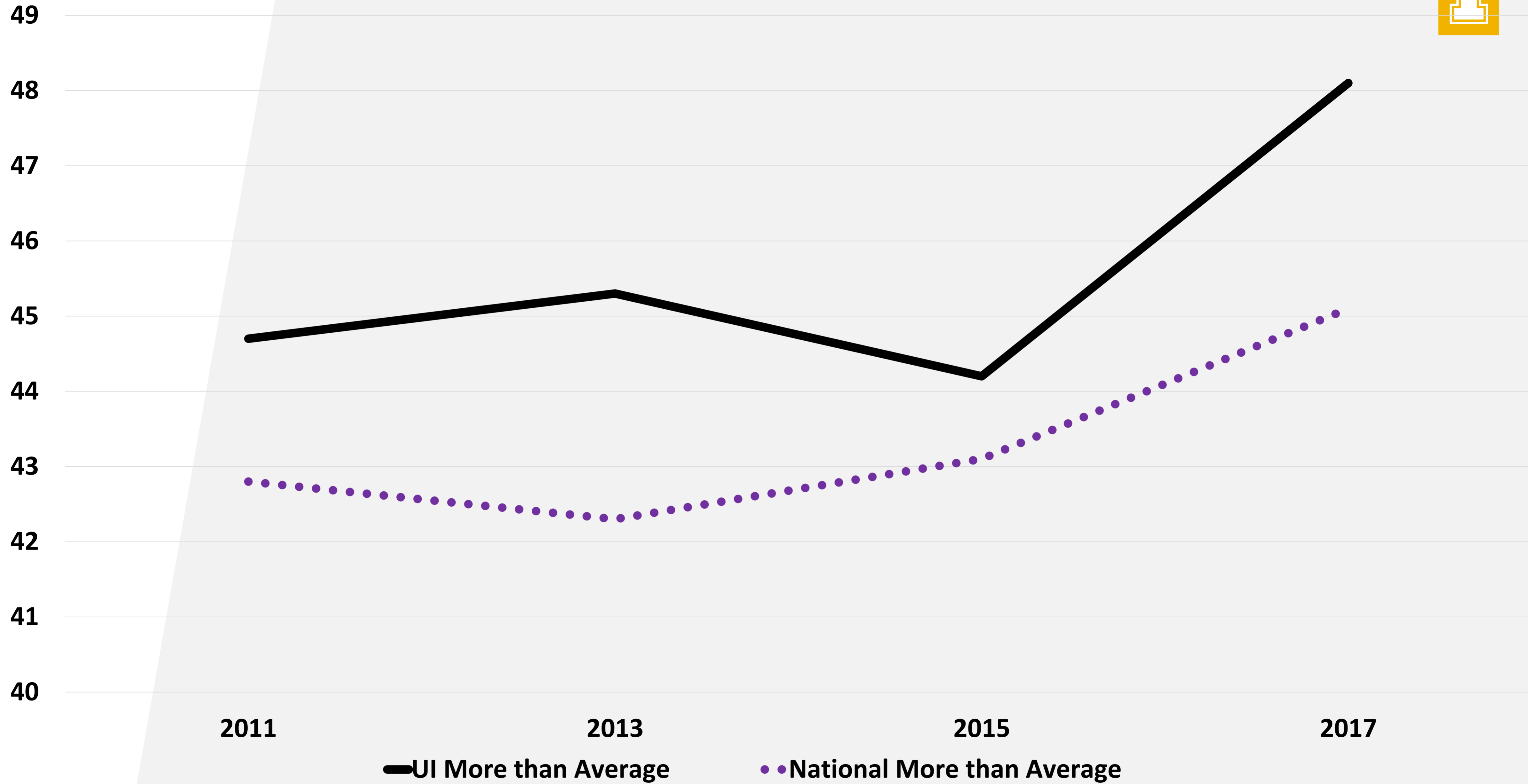

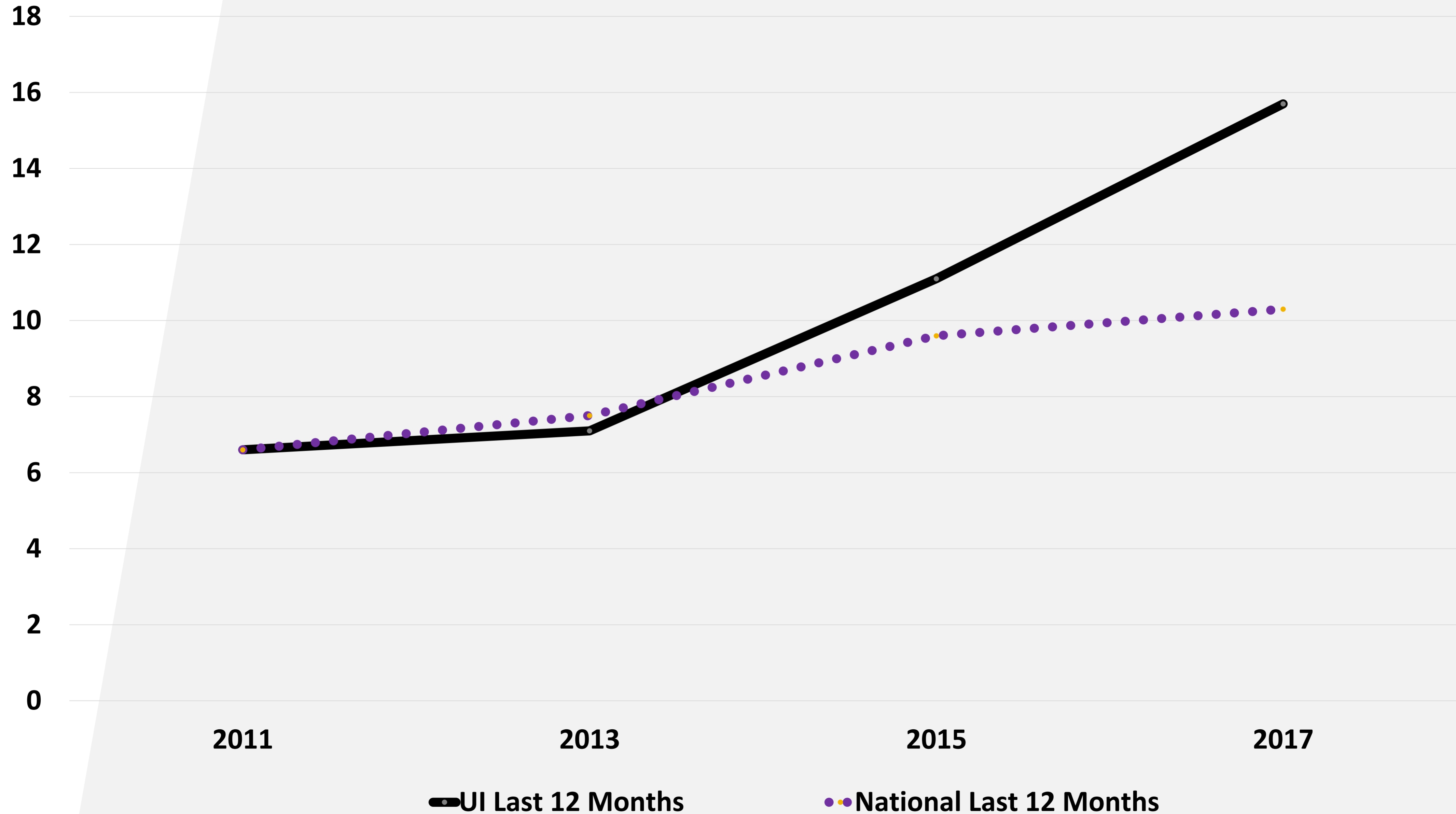

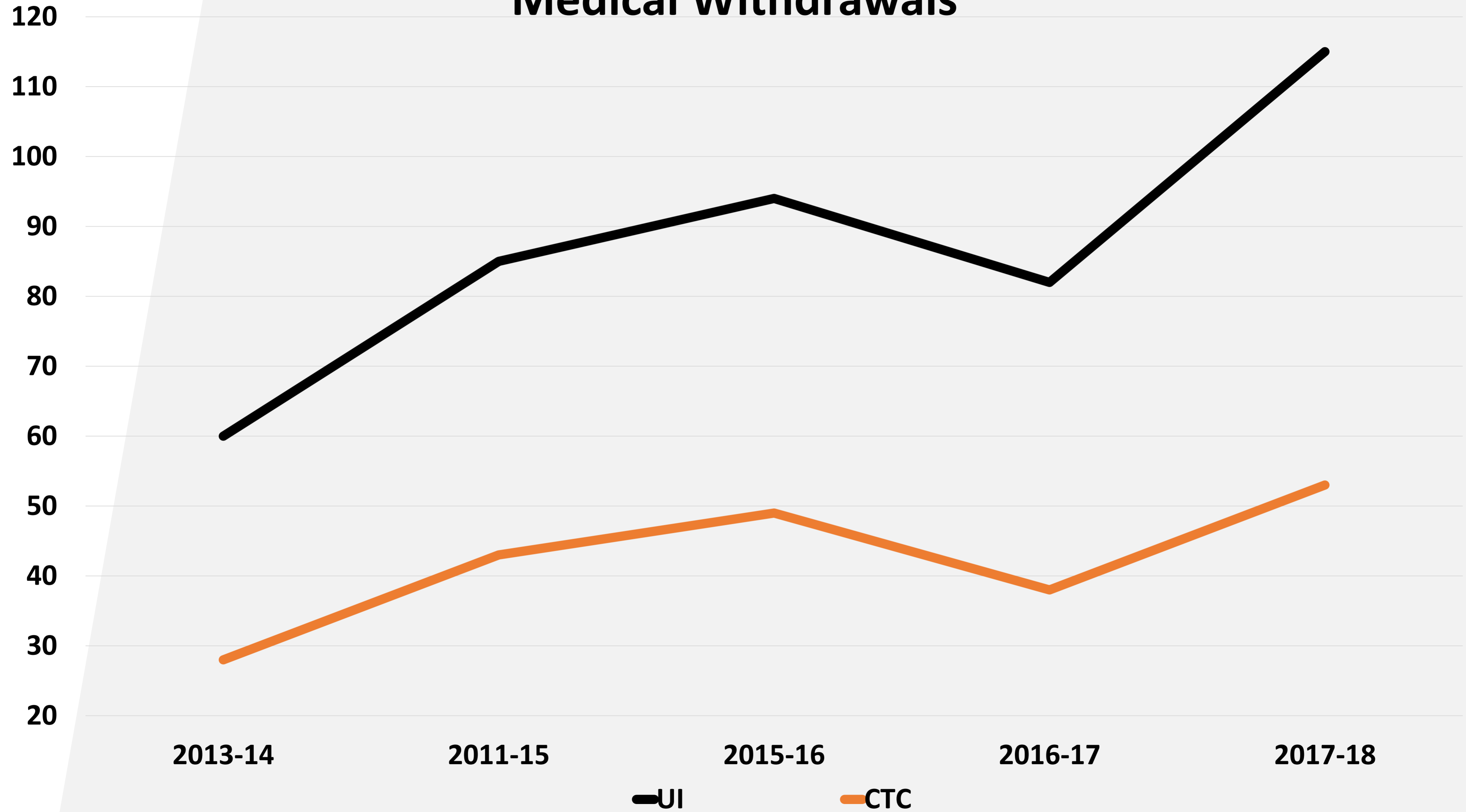

4 IMPORTANT TAKEAWAYS

- Severity of mental health issues is *increasing* at the University of Idaho
- Self-harming, suicidal ideation and suicide attempts *have also shown increases*
- Counseling Center clients have consistently *higher* acuity of mental health symptoms
- Demand for clinical services at the CTC has been steadily *increasing* in the past decade
