Basic Capabilities

- Automated closed captioning
 - “Panopto automatically produces closed captioning for the vocals in your videos.”
- Uploading existing content
 - “Many of us have existing video content coming from Stream or other streaming platforms. All that content could be uploaded into your Panopto library.”
 - “Note that there is a lag associated with processing the video and closed-captioning of uploaded videos—what looks to be about 25% of the length of the video—so you may have to wait a few seconds or minutes before your video is available.
 - CETL can help you with that
- Web-based recording
 - “Panopto allows you to record directly into Canvas through your web-browser. You can add multiple video sources as well meaning you can record you with your camera—or multiple cameras—as well as other windows or your full screen. I’ll demonstrate this shortly.”
- Library of recordings sectioned class-by-class
- Editing

Access In Canvas

- Rich Content Editor (RCE)
 - NOTE: I, colloquially, call this the ‘editing box’
 - “You can embed videos anywhere you have access to the RCE—on your home page, in announcements, in instructions to assignments or quizzes—anywhere you add content.”
 - DEMO: “The Panopto button lives here in the icon bar. It opens the Panopto dialog box where you can choose a video from your existing library, uploading a video from your local computer, or to record a video on the spot.”
- External Tool in Modules (direct links)
 - “You can add a video directly to a module.
