

- o a weekly video introduction
- o profiles in all the tools you use
- setting due dates around times you can provide support





- Use of video
 - o for discussions
 - FlipGrid or Padlet
 - o for lessons or assignments
 - **TEDEd** or **EDpuzzle** or Google Forms





- Use rubrics to set clear expectations
 - borrow ideas from others
 - RCampus iRubric
 - o map to standards
 - example





- Foster communication
 - o <u>ldeas</u>
 - empower students by tracking questions
 - Consider Q & A in Google Slides
 - Leverage use of chat/reactions in Zoom
 - Polling, AnswerGarden







- Feedback should be a give and take
 - provide comments, give reasons, nudge for improvement, inspire growth
 - o lesson reflections or surveys
 - Google Form templates
