

Dual Credit

What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit allows high school students to take college courses while still enrolled in high school. These classes count for both high school and college credit. High school students who complete dual credit classes take fewer classes in college and save money on their total college costs.

Courses Offered

Dual Credit students may take courses at their high school & on the U of I campus.

Tuition and Fees

Students are charged \$75/credit for any dual credit course, includes taking the course at the high school or on campus. The student is responsible for all course related fees and textbooks.

Grades

Advanced Opportunities



The Fast Forward program provides every student attending an **Idaho public school** an allocation of **\$4,125** to use towards Advanced Opportunities in grades 7-12.

Dual Credit are courses taken by high school students that are transcribed on their high school and college transcripts. The Fast Forward program can pay for up to \$75 per credit. Dual Credit courses can be taken at the high school; in some cases, students can go directly to the college. Students can track expenditures of their allocation by creating an account in the Advanced Opportunities portal.

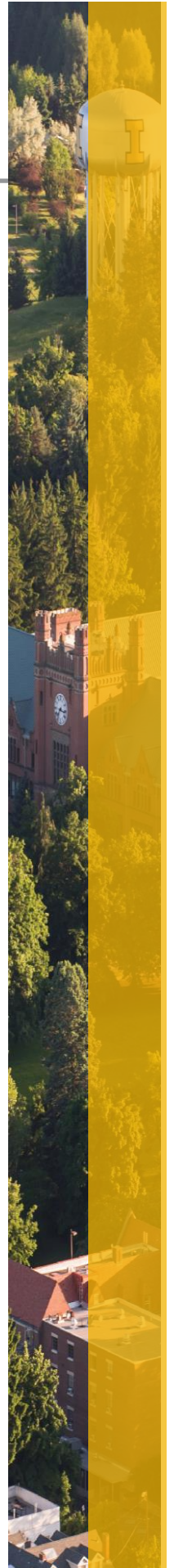
Drops & Withdrawals

Students dropping courses before the drop deadline are entitled to a 100% refund of tuition and fees.

A withdrawal after the deadlines will result in a W on their permanent transcript. Students may view their grades through the VandalWeb student portal.

If a student failed or withdrew from a course in a previous semester, the student must self-pay for their courses in the following semester. Fast Forward funds may not be used for repeated course work.

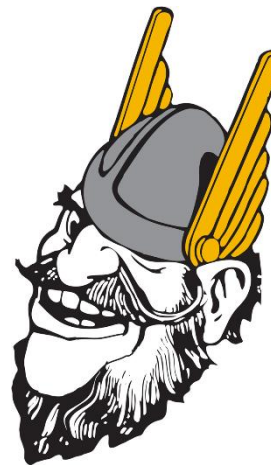

High School Seniors

Apply as a First-Year student:

- Apply: www.uidaho.edu/admissions/apply
- No application fee for **Idaho residents!**
- Your Vandal number will stay the same.
- If your ACT or SAT scores are on your school transcript, you do not need to have them sent separately.
- Since you have not yet graduated from high school, a transcript showing all completed work may be accepted for early admission.
- Submit official transcripts from any colleges or universities attended.
- Students who submit their admissions application and FAFSA by Dec. 1 will be considered for all available scholarships.

Admission and Registration

New Dual Credit Students

1. Complete the Dual Credit Admissions Application

- www.dualcredit.uidaho.edu/students/#enroll
- Use your legal birth name.
 - The information provided is used to create your official University of Idaho account.
- Enter a personal e-mail that you have access to today.
- 5 - 7 business days after submission, you will receive an e-mail from the Admissions Office to the e-mail you entered on your admission application with your Vandal ID number (V00123456)
 - **Save your Vandal #. You will need your V# each semester for course registration.**

2. Payment Methods

- Work with your high school to get your Advanced Opportunities funds School Level Approved.
- Or Self-Pay



3. Register for classes

- Complete the Course Registration form.
- Write in your legal name and V#, inaccurate information cause registration errors.
- Collect all required signatures.
- Submit the completed Course Registration form to your high school counselor by the deadline.

Accessing Your Vandal Account

I. Account Management

As a student, you are automatically provided with one University of Idaho account. To go through the initial setup process to activate your account, you will need access to the phone number or e-mail address provided on your admissions application.

- 1) Start by resetting your password at vandalsetup.uidaho.edu
- 2) Enter your Vandal number found on the Admissions e-mail. (ex. **V00123456**)
- 3) A 6-digit code will be sent to your e-mail or phone to verify access.
- 4) Change your password, and be sure to save your Vandal e-mail, (joev1234@vandals.uidaho.edu) and new password.
- 5) Set up your Security Profile in Account Management. You can opt. out of the security profile, but this will mean that any time you forget your password, you will need to contact the Student Technology Center to gain access.

- 3) The grades I earn will become part of my permanent college record. If I decide to drop a class, my high school counselor must confirm my request to drop by sending a request to registrar@uidaho.edu. Some classes require the completion of two semesters to earn college credit; a decision not to complete both semesters will require withdrawal. Withdrawing from class(es), will result in my permanent transcript showing withdrawn. No refunds are granted for withdrawals.
- 4) I understand that credit transfer is determined by my high school and/or any future college or university. Each university has their own transfer policy.
- 5) I understand content of a university course may be more mature in nature (discussions, readings, visual material etc.) The expectation is that the student's behavior and performance will be equivalent to that of a university student.
- 6) I understand my educational records are protected under [FERPA](#), and my personal signature is required to release them.
- 7) Per OSBE policy; "Students under the age of 16 who are enrolled in a secondary school may seek admission to enroll in courses provided on the post-secondary campus by submitting a petition to the high school principal's office and to the admissions office of the post-secondary institution."
