

**WWAMI Medical Education Program
Proposed Catalog Changes
Effective Summer 2018**

1. Add the following courses:

MedS 506 Introduction to Primary & Continuity Care Clerkship (4 cr)

Introduces medical students to continuity of care by working with practicing physicians and coinciding with instruction in communication skills, interviewing techniques, physical examinations, documentation, and clinical reasoning. Includes hospital-based patient encounters with an introduction to and the development of the physician role. Topics covered in primary and preventative care, geriatrics, rehabilitation, palliative care, behavioral health, and pain management. Pass/Fail only. Offered Fall

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

Available via distance: No

Rationale: THIS COURSE IS A COMBINATION OF Former MedS 513 AND MedS 505, which provides medical students with integrated preceptorship experiences and clinical skills practices/modalities. The longitudinal and combined format of this course incorporates medical students' exposure to continuity of care alongside practicing physicians. Note: UW Course MedSci 502.

MedS 507 Introduction to Primary & Continuity Care Clerkship (4 cr)

Introduces medical students to continuity of care by working with practicing physicians and coinciding with instruction in communication skills, interviewing techniques, physical examinations, documentation, and clinical reasoning. Includes hospital-based patient encounters with an introduction to and the development of the physician role. Topics covered in primary and preventative care, geriatrics, rehabilitation, palliative care, behavioral health, and pain management. Pass/Fail only. Offered Fall

MedS 508 Introduction to Primary & Continuity Care Clerkship (4 cr)

MedS 509 Introduction to Primary & Continuity Care Clerkship (4 cr)

Introduces medical students to continuity of care by working with practicing physicians and coinciding with instruction in communication skills, interviewing techniques, physical examinations, documentation, and clinical reasoning. Includes hospital-based patient encounters with an introduction to and the development of the physician role. Topics covered in primary and preventative care, geriatrics, rehabilitation, palliative care, behavioral health, and pain management. Pass/Fail only. Offered Fall

MedS 515 Ecology of Health & Medicine-Foundations 1 (1 cr)

This course integrates School of Medicine thematic content with an emphasis on core concepts needed for clinical practice in the changing healthcare environment. Students will explore areas related to humanism in medicine including the themes of diversity, health equity, ethics, professionalism, and determinants of health.

Pass/Fail only. Fall and Spring

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

MedS 525 Ecology of Health & Medicine-Foundations 2 (1 cr)

This course integrates School of Medicine thematic content with an emphasis on core concepts needed for clinical practice in the changing healthcare environment. Students will explore areas related to humanism in medicine including the themes of diversity, health equity, ethics, professionalism, and determinants of health.

Pass/Fail only. Fall and Spring

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

MedS 536 Ecology of Health & Medicine-Foundations 3 (1 cr)

This course integrates School of Medicine thematic content with an emphasis on core concepts needed for clinical practice in the changing healthcare environment. Students will explore areas related to humanism in medicine including the themes of diversity, health equity, ethics, professionalism, and determinants of health.

Pass/Fail only. Fall and Spring

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

MedS 545 Ecology of Health & Medicine-Foundations 4 (1 cr)

This course integrates School of Medicine thematic content with an emphasis on core concepts needed for clinical practice in the changing healthcare environment. Students will explore areas related to humanism in medicine including the themes of diversity, health equity, ethics, professionalism, and determinants of health.

Pass/Fail only. Fall and Spring

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

Available via distance: No

Rationale: (Editor's note: applies to 515, 525, 536, and 545). The UWSOM is improving its curriculum to fit in with dominant national trends, which are incorporating thematic curricula related to form and function of health systems, systems improvements, lifelong learning, communication/interprofessional education, and population health. Students will cultivate systems thinking, leadership skills, and a scholarly approach for both the humanism and health systems components of this course. Students will also explore areas related to humanism in medicine including the themes of diversity, health equity, ethics, professionalism, and determinants of health. This fourth week builds on initial content area from the first three weeks and prepares the students for application of all content in the clerkship setting. clinical scenarios.

2. Change the following courses:

MedS 540 Blood, ~~and Cancer~~ & Musculoskeletal (5-8cr)

This course familiarizes students with the basic pathophysiologic mechanisms leading to disturbances of red cell, white cell, and platelet production, as well as abnormalities of hemostasis presenting clinical problems, ~~with an emphasis on pathophysiology. Additionally, this course will include relevant fundamental scientific principles in anatomy, pathology and pharmacology.~~ The musculoskeletal content will focus on clinical manifestations in the musculoskeletal system and pathophysiology of trauma, aging, infection, and inflammation. Graded Pass/Fail. (Spring only)

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

Rationale: Multiple UW School of Medicine Curriculum Committee has endorsed a slightly revised Blood and Cancer course that includes an integrated two week introduction to musculoskeletal anatomy.

3. Drop the following courses

MedS 505 Introductory Primary and Community Care Clerkship (2 cr, max 6)

Introduces medical students to continuity of care by working with participating physicians. The course demonstrates how to work with an individual to help them achieve optimal health, and includes topics in primary and preventative care, geriatrics, rehabilitation, palliative care, behavioral health and pain management. Graded Pass/Fail. (Fall and Spring)

Prereq: Admission to the University of Washington School of Medicine WWAMI program

MedS 513 Clinical Skills (2 cr)

Instruction in communication skills, interviewing techniques, physical examinations, documentation and clinical reasoning. This course will include hospital-based patient encounters and developing comfort and introduction to the physician role. Graded Pass/Fail only. (Fall and Spring)
