1. Change the following courses:

Law 948 ~~Introduction to Natural~~ Public Lands and Resources Law (3 cr)

~~An introduction to natural resource law examining~~ This course examines the natural resource allocation and management systems applicable to the public lands, including the Federal Land Policy and Management Act, National Forest Management Act, Mineral Leasing Act, Wilderness Act, ESA, FLPMA, NEPA, NFMA, Wilderness Act, WSR, and other relevant federal statutes. ~~applicable to the public lands.~~

Geographical Area: Moscow

Rationale: This course name change allows the title to better communicate the subject matter of the course. The course's primary focus has been and remains the nation's public lands, and the allocation and management of the resources those lands provide. The current title is potentially misleading, both by including "introduction" in the title—which might suggest advanced courses will follow—and by focusing on "natural resources" generally rather than the public lands more specifically. The public lands are a significant component of the western landscape with a specific body of law unrelated and inapplicable to non-public lands contexts.

Real-life experience handling transactional legal problems and assisting businesses and not-for-profits.

Prereq: Law 919 and Law 962; and Law 966, Law 967, or Law 971; and permission; and qualification for limited license as legal intern in Idaho

Rationale: Change reflects the evolution of the clinic in handling general entrepreneurship matters. No additional workload anticipated.
