2018-19 Meeting #1, September 10, 2018

Chairperson Raney opened the meeting at 3:30 PM in the Pitman Cataldo Room.

UCC-19-002 International Programs Office

Kate Wray-Chettri introduced the changes. The new site in Thailand was approved unanimously.

UCC-19-001 College of Education, Health and Human Sciences

Chairperson Raney introduced the changes. He explained that the switch from “Professional-Technical” to “Career and Technical Education” is an industry standard. A typo was noted in ED 587: the errant “of” should be removed. The Curriculum and Instruction course changes were approved unanimously.

Raney noted that the Art Teaching Minor lives in the Curriculum and Instruction portion of the catalog, but the proposed changes are the result of a recent Art and Architecture accreditation visit. The changes were approved unanimously.

Raney noted that the Education Core was being embedded in the Family and Consumer Sciences option. The changes to the Major in Career and Technical Education were approved unanimously.

Raney noted that the changes to the Health Education Teaching Minor reflect actual course offerings. He also noted that there are two Math teaching endorsements available: either the single 45-credit major or both the 30-credit and 20-credit minors. He noted that courses are being replaced by K-12-specific materials. Dwaine Hubbard noted that the teaching minor is now larger than the major used to be. The changes to the Health Education Teaching Minor and the Math Teaching Majors/Minors were approved unanimously.

The changes to H&S 423 were approved unanimously.

Bert Baumgaertner asked whether the Prefix change from REC to RSTM would be noted in students’ audits. Representatives from the Registrar’s Office explained that the courses are coded as identical in the course records system. The new prefix was approved unanimously.

UCC-19-003 College of Art and Architecture

Raney noted that the rationale says the certificate is being proposed, not changed. Rebecca Frost explained that it is being split into two tracks, which originally came through the Registrar’s Office as a proposal to add a brand new certificate. The changes were approved unanimously.

Hearing no additional questions, Chairperson Raney closed the meeting at 3:53. UCC will reconvene on Monday, September 17.
