2018-19 Meeting #10, November 26, 2018

Chairperson Raney opened the meeting at 3:30 PM in the Pitman Cataldo room. The UCC9 minutes were approved.

UCC-19-016-Tabled College of Art and Architecture

The committee clarified the course prerequisites: VTD 271 should read “154 and 244; or permission,” while VTD 400 should read “356 or permission.” The tabled courses were approved.

UCC-19-018-Tabled College of Agricultural and Life Sciences

The LDRS prefix has been changed to CLDR. It was noted that the prefix itself should be labeled “Community-based Leadership.” The tabled changes from Agricultural and Extension Education were approved. The Agricultural Economics courses were tabled.

David Pimentel asked why AGECE 433 appeared in Agricultural Economics and Sanjay Sisodiya explained that it is intended as a follow up to the courses AGECE 333 and MKTG 422.

UCC-19-017-Returned College of Business and Economics

Sisodiya noted to the committee that the department intended to add an additional elective, but missed it on the original paperwork. The change was approved.

UCC-19-024-Returned College of Letters, Arts and Social Sciences/College of Law

The committee approved the addition of language that deals with distance credits.

UCC-19-028 College of Art and Architecture

Jean-Marc Gauthier introduced the new certificate and the four new lab courses, which complement existing courses. The courses and the certificate were approved.

UCC-19-029a and b College of Business and Economics

Sisodiya introduced the proposals: a new minor and a new option, both in Sales. He explained that a significant portion of Marketing students go into sales and these curricula have been developed to provide them the necessary skills. He explained that the minor is open to all majors, while the option is exclusive to Marketing students.

Sisodiya noted – to the committee’s surprise – that the nearest comparable Sales program is at Oregon State University. “We know students are going into this field,” he said, and so we should be oriented towards enhancing their preparation. The minor and option were approved.

Chairperson Raney closed the meeting at 3:56 PM.
