



# Limited Submission Funding Opportunity

**SPONSOR:** National Science Foundation

**PROGRAM:** ADVANCE: Organizational Change for Gender Equity in STEM Academic Professions (***Adaptation and Partnership Tracks***)

**LIMIT ON NUMBER OF FULL PROPOSALS PER INSTITUTION:** One proposal per institution per track (***Adaptation and Partnership Tracks***)

Eligible institutions can submit one ADVANCE **Adaptation** proposal. Institutions of Higher Education may be partners on multiple ADVANCE **Partnership** proposals in the same competition, but can be the lead organization only on one **Partnership** proposal in the same competition.

**LIMIT ON NUMBER OF FULL PROPOSALS PER PI:** There are no restrictions or limits.

**AWARD:** Up to \$1,000,000 for three years (*Adaptation Track* awards); Up to \$1,000,000 for three to five years (*Partnership Track* awards)

**OVERVIEW:** The Research and Faculty Development (RFD) team in the Office of Research and Economic Development is requesting notice of intent (NOI) to indicate interest in submitting a proposal to the ***Adaptation and Partnership Tracks*** of the NSF ADVANCE: Organizational Change for Gender Equity in STEM Academic Professions program, a limited submission funding opportunity. The University of Idaho can serve as the lead institution on one Adaptation Track proposal and one Partnership proposal to the ADVANCE program. RFD will use an internal review process to determine which proposals will be submitted to NSF. Interested individuals must submit an NOI by **July 15, 2019**.

**SYNOPSIS:** The NSF ADVANCE program goal is to broaden the implementation of evidence-based systemic change strategies that promote equity for STEM faculty in academic workplaces and the academic profession. The NSF ADVANCE program provides grants to enhance the systemic factors that support equity and inclusion and to mitigate the systemic factors that create inequities in the academic profession and workplaces. All NSF ADVANCE proposals are expected to use intersectional approaches in the design of systemic change strategies for STEM faculty in recognition that gender, race and ethnicity do not exist in isolation from each other and from other categories of social identity. The solicitation includes four funding tracks: ***Adaptation, Partnership, Institutional Transformation (IT), and Catalyst***; these limited submission opportunity guidelines apply only to the ***Adaptation and Partnership Tracks***.
