SPONSOR: National Science Foundation

PROGRAM: Research Traineeship (NRT) Program

LIMIT ON NUMBER OF FULL PROPOSALS PER INSTITUTION: 2

An eligible organization may participate in two proposals per competition. Participation includes serving as a lead organization, non-lead organization, or subawardee on any proposal.

LIMIT ON NUMBER OF FULL PROPOSALS PER PI: 1

An individual may serve as Lead Principal Investigator (PI) or co-PI on only one proposal submitted to the NRT program per annual competition.

AWARD: NRT Awards are expected to be up to five (5) years in duration with a total budget up to \$3,000,000.

OVERVIEW: The Research and Faculty Development (RFD) team in the Office of Research and Economic Development is requesting notice of intent (NOI) to apply for the National Science Foundation (NSF) Research Traineeship (NRT) program, a limited submission funding opportunity. Only two University of Idaho faculty members can participate in this competition, whether serving as a lead, non-lead, or subawardee on a proposal to the NRT program, and RFD will use an internal review process to determine which proposals will be submitted to NSF. Interested individuals must submit an NOI to RFD by 5:00 p.m. PT on Monday, **August 19, 2019**.

SYNOPSIS: The NRT program supports the development and implementation of bold, new, and potentially transformative models for STEM graduate education training. The program is dedicated to effective training of STEM graduate students in high priority interdisciplinary or convergent research areas, through the use of a comprehensive traineeship model that is innovative, evidence-based, and aligned with changing workforce and research needs. Proposals are requested in any interdisciplinary or convergent research theme of national priority, with special emphasis on the research areas in [NSF's 10 Big Ideas](#).
